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# **1. OVERVIEW OF GOVERNMENT COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING SRIRANGAM**

## **1.1 HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE**

Government College of Engineering, Srirangam , was started during the academic year 2013 - 2014 and is located on a 37 acres site. This is the one among the 11 Government Engineering Colleges in Tamil Nadu and the 10<sup>th</sup> State owned Government Engineering College in Tamil Nadu. The first batch of students was selected from the academic year 2013-2014 for courses in Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and Computer Science Engineering. Mechatronics Engineering is started from the academic year 2025-2026.

The Administrative block hosts Principal office, Administrative office, Civil Engineering Department, Mechanical Engineering Department, Electrical & Electronics Engineering Department, Electronics & Communication Engineering Department, and Computer Science Engineering Department and Mechatronics Engineering Department. There are separate buildings for Workshop, Auditorium, Indoor auditorium, Boys Hostel, Girls Hostel, Gymnasium, Guest House and Principal Quarters.

The Departments cater to the needs of the various undergraduate programs that are offered with well-equipped laboratories. Computers with internet connectivity are available in all departments. A state of art E- Smart Class rooms are available for each and every department which combines technology and innovation to make the students enhance their Technical skills in their respective fields.

The college is gaining momentum towards the cause of Engineering education. Since its inception, the college is striving incessantly in producing skilled engineers through quality education.

## **1.2 Research and Development**

Our college provides ample opportunities and encouragement for faculties to do research in all the Engineering and Science and Humanities departments. The steady internet connection to all the laboratories, classrooms and hostel rooms in the campus make the teaching learning process an easy one.

## 1.6 Extra- Curricular Activitie

## 1.8 Placement

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## **LIBRARY**

Our Library, the Seat of Wisdom and the Source of Knowledge sprawling 528.15 sq.mt.is situated in a cozy atmosphere conducive for the pursuit of higher studies. It is equipped with books on various engineering subjects such as Electronics Communication Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Civil Engineering and Computer Science Engineering. Journals – both E-Journals and Print Journals, Magazines and Newspapers etc. are available for enriching the knowledge of the faculty, research scholars and students.

## **LIBRARY SECTIONS**

Our college library functions systematically with carefully maintained Circulation Section, Reference Section, Reading Section Acquisition Section, Stack Room Section, Periodical Section, Digital Library, Reprographic Section, Technical Section and Back Volume Section for catering to the needs of the students.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Perfect silence should be maintained in the Library.
2. Students and Faculties must scan his/her ID card before entering and after leaving the Library for Gate Entry Purpose.
3. Strict discipline must be maintained in the Library. Indiscipline may lead to disciplinary action and the Library privileges may be withdrawn.
4. The Library is open for students from 10.00 a.m to 5.30 p.m on all working days.
5. Books will be issued only on presentation of his/her own ID card.

6. Library books should be handled with care. The student shall not write or make any mark on any Book, Journal and newspapers belonging to the Library.
7. Students must be in person while receiving a book, examine and report to the library.
8. Students can borrow two books only.
9. The book lending period for students is 15 days, for faculty it is 30 days and it is not permitted to keep the book for a long period without renewing it.
10. If the book is not returned on or before the due date, the fine charges of 0.50 paise will be charged as fine on first 20 days. After 20 days, Rupee 1 per book per day will be collected.
11. Reference books/ Journals/ Magazines/ CD-RoM should not be issued / taken outside the Library.
12. Before leaving the library, students must arrange the chairs and tables properly.
13. In case, a borrower loses a book he/she should replace the new copy of the same book or should pay triple the cost of the books.
14. The college leaving certificate or transfer certificate will be issued to the student only after he/she has returned all the library books and cleared all library dues.

## **9. GENERAL AMENITIES**

### **ATM**

State Bank of India provides ATM facility inside the college campus functioning from Monday to Friday.

### **CCTV Monitoring:**

The campus surveillance under CCTV monitoring and recording system ensures personal safety, protection of building, infrastructure and assets.

### **Physical Education:**

The department offers coaching for various games and track events. The college campus also hosts an indoor gymnasium to keep the students fit and healthy.

### **Internet/WI-FI facility**

The College is equipped with 300Mbps internet connection covering entire administrative block and hostel blocks

### **Principal Quarters & Guest House**

The college is provided with a Principal Quarters for the effective management of the campus. Besides, the college also has Guest Houses for the guests to use them when they appear for any academic and professional purposes.

## **10. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS**

1. The students are encouraged to greet the staff in the college and hostel by saying “Vanakkam” or “Good Morning”.
2. A minimum of 75% attendance in subjects, tour and camps are insisted for each semester.
3. Students should be punctual to college and for each class.
4. Attendance for the college examination is compulsory and leave or absence from the examination is permitted only on valid reasons.
5. Students should maintain good progress and conduct which are pre-requisites for appearing in the university examination.
6. Students should avail leave with previous sanction of the faculty advisor. For unforeseen causes, the students have to produce the leave application along with the medical certificate from the college doctor or they should produce evidence for the same. Students who avail leave should furnish their address to the principal and to the deputy warden.
7. In case of serious illness and infectious diseases, the students should report to the Deputy Warden concerned and college medical officer.
8. Dress Code:

## HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS

(COMMON TO BOYS AND GIRLS)

1. Application for admission to the hostel shall be made in the prescribed form which can be had from the Hostel Office.
2. Allotment of rooms shall be made by the Deputy Wardens under the orders of Warden.
3. Students must occupy the rooms allotted to them and should not change/exchange rooms without prior permission from the Deputy Warden/Hostel Authorities. Violations of this rule will result in the Expulsion of the student concerned from the hostel.
4. Resident Member may be shifted from one room to another without assigning any reason by the Deputy Warden.
5. Hostel Furniture shall not be removed from one room to another under any circumstances. Students are responsible for the care of furniture and fittings in their respective rooms. **The cost of furniture and fittings will be recovered from them in case of any damage or loss along with the fine of Rs.1000/-.**
6. Students are not allowed to use extra electrical fitting in their rooms like water heaters etc.
7. All the rooms, doors and windows should be kept neat and tidy. **A fine of Rs.2000** will be levied for disfiguring of doors, glass panels, Furniture and walls of rooms from the resident(s) of the room in addition to the amount needed for repairing and repainting the above.
8. A Collective **fine of Rs.3000/-** will be collected from the residents of the respective wings/floors for disfiguring Veranda's and Bathrooms in addition to the amount needed for repairing the above.
9. A Collective **fine of Rs.5000/-** will be collected from the residents of respective blocks for disfiguring the common rooms or damaging the hostel properties in the hostel blocks, in addition to the replacement cost.
10. Students should keep the toilets and bathrooms clean.
11. Residents are instructed to switch off the lights and fans when they go out of the rooms, to save electric power. A fine of Rs.250/- per day will be collected from the residents of the rooms, who violate this instruction.
12. Guests /Visitors are not permitted to enter any rooms allotted to the residents. Anyone who

violates or helps to violate this rule will be levied a **fine of Rs.1000/-** and will be evicted from the hostel by the hostel authorities.

13. If any misuse of computers and mobile phones in hostel rooms is brought to notice of Hostel authorities the respective resident(s) will be expelled from the hostel.

14. Students should not arrange any functions or meetings within the hostel /collage campus or outside the campus, without prior permission from the Principal and Warden.

15. Any student who is removed from the college will automatically cease to be a member of the hostel.

16. Accommodation in the hostel will not be given to students who are not active boarders in the hostel.

17. No student should stay away from the hostel on any day without the prior permission of the concerned Deputy Warden/Associate Warden/Principal and Warden.

18. Abnormal activities of any nature causing disturbance to neighbours should not be carried out in the rooms.

19. Students should not paste any posters /pictures etc on the walls, doors, windows and shelves. Cut-outs should not be placed or brought in the hostel.

20. Students should not keep large amounts of cash or costly items like mobile phones, camera, electronic gadgets, jewellery etc. in their rooms. Hostel administration is not responsible for the loss or theft of such costly items.

21. Married students are not eligible for hostel accommodation.

22. Students should not keep Mopeds, Motor cycles, Scooters and cars in the hostel premises.

23. Students should settle in their rooms at 9 pm at studies on normal days and at 10 pm on free night days (Saturdays and Sundays) & maintain silence.

24. Girl students should return to the hostel before 6.30 pm and boys before 8 pm on all days.

25. The hostel will be personally inspected by the Deputy Warden and other authorities regularly. The residents will be subjected to sever disciplinary action if they fail to follow above mentioned rules and regulations.

#### EXTRACT OF ACT NO.7 OF 1997

An Act to prohibit “Ragging” in educational institutions in the state of Tamilnadu.

#### SHORT TITLE, EXTENT AND COMMENCEMENT:

1. i) This act may be called in the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997.

ii) It extends to the whole of the State of Tamil Nadu.

iii) It shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of December 1996.

**Definition:**

2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires, 'Ragging' means display of noisy disorderly conduct doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes,

- a) Teasing , abusing of ,playing practical jokes on ,or causing hurt to such students /or
- b) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course, willingly do.

**Prohibition of Ragging:**

3. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.

**Penalty for Ragging :**

4. Whoever directly or indirectly, participates in abets or propagates “ragging” within or outside any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to fined which may extend to Rs.10,000.

**Dismissal of student:**

5. Any student convicted of an offence under the section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

**Suspension of student:**

6. 1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complaints of ragging to the Head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for management of the educational institution, such head of the educational institution or person responsible for the management educational institution shall enquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

2) The decision of the Head of the educational institution or person responsible for the management of educational institution is final if any student has indulged in ragging under sub section no.1

### **BOARDING RULES:**

1. The Hostel month will be from 20th of the preceeding month to the 19th of the current month (Both days inclusive).The mess bill will be put up on the notice board by the 1st of the succeeding month .All hostel bills should be paid before the 19th of that month positively.
2. For late payment a fine of Rs.50/-(Rupees Fifty only) will be collected up to 25th .After 25th and up to the end of the month , a fine of Rs.100/-(Rupees one hundred only)will be collected.
3. From first of next month, the defaulted boarders will be expelled from the mess (not permitted to dine in the mess) till he/she clears mess dues with fine .An admission fee of Rs.200 /-(Rupees Two hundred only) will be collected in addition to the mess bill and fine .If he/she is expelled for three times he/she will not be permitted to stay in the hostel further. Readmission is permitted only three times during the course of study.
4. If any student discontinues from the hostel it will be intimated to the government and the scholarship will be provided only to active boarders.
5. Deatils of the mess bill will be displayed in the hostel mess notice boards. Students should check the details and clear the dues within the due date.
6. Bill particulars will also be given in the mess dues intimation card sent to the parent. Non receipt of the intimation cards should not be given as a reason for delay in payment.
7. No reductions will be given for absences in the mess .Only on special cases a reduction is permitted with due permission from the Principal & Warden and Deputy Warden well in advance, preferably before 2 days

Inmates will be allowed to go home once in a month only if parents give written requisitions stating the reason, duration of stay etc. They will be permitted to go home only for valid reasons; the parents should apply to the Deputy Warden directly for permission to send their daughter to the home. The Girl students are not permitted to go to guardian's house for overnight stay unless there is a specific written requisition from parents.

Only 3 authorised visitors (including parents) are permitted. They should have the visitors cards with photo affixed (and signed by the Associate Warden) when they call on their wards. Visitors are requested to visit their wards only during visiting hours.

Girl students should return to the hostel before 6.30 p.m.

Roll call will be taken at 6.30 p.m.

Students should not keep large amount of cash or costly items like Mobile Phone, Camera, Electronic gadgets etc in their rooms. If there is any loss, the management will not be responsible.

Girl's students are advised not to wear costly jewellery items.

Girl's students are permitted to go out during holidays for a maximum duration of 6 hours after signing in the register kept for the purpose. They have to get prior permission from the Deputy Warden, if they want to go out for a duration exceeding 6 hours and limited to 8 hours.
